• School menus, meals and snacks

- Today your child will be bringing home a menu booklet from city catering. Please keep this safely to be able to check with your child what they would like for lunch each day. We will no longer be including the menu on the newsletter, but it will be added to the new website.
- Please ensure dinner monies are given to the class teacher on a Monday morning in a labelled envelope. Daily numbers are placed with the kitchen by 10am, so meals for children going home after that time will still be charged. Reminder for parents/carers of children in year 3, that your child is no longer entitled to a free meal under the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) scheme. Meals remain at £2.20 per day, £11.00 a week.
- The kitchen will be offering toast (25p), crumpets (30p) and/or a fruit cup (30p) at mid-morning break.

School Clubs

Yesterday, your child brought home a letter regarding the fantastic range of clubs we are offering the children this term. Please ensure the reply slip is returned by next **Tuesday 15**th **September**. As spaces for most clubs is limited, we do retain all children's names on a waiting list for any club that is oversubscribed. Your child will be bringing home a copy of a Club Record card by next Friday 18th confirming on which clubs they have been allocated a space. Clubs then start the week commencing 21st September.

• Stanley Head Information Meeting

Parents/carers of Y6 children going to Stanley Head the week after next are reminded of the information meeting this Monday 14th September at 6:00 p.m. in the hall.

As well as receiving information about the week, you will need to complete forms for Stanley Head staff and so it is **vital** that you bring with you:

- ✓ Your child's NHS number
- ✓ Emergency contact numbers
- ✓ Date of your child's last tetanus
- ✓ And a pen to fill in the forms!

School Uniform

During the last academic year, following efforts to return unclaimed school uniform, a huge quantity of lost property was donated to various worthy causes. In an effort to reduce this and to hopefully save you anguish and expense we are proposing to introduce a uniform name labelling scheme.

Mrs Arnott and Mrs Brennan will go to each class and following children checking their own clothes, any that are not named will be labelled with the child's name using a laundry marker pen. If you **do not** wish this to be done to your child's uniform, coats and P.E. kit, but will label them yourself, then please pass a note onto your child's class teacher as soon as possible.

• Hopper Bus

From the start of next week, the Hopper Bus will be on Heathcote Street car park and Youth Services will be running activity sessions for children aged 11 to 16 years. The buses will be staffed with people on hand to talk about issues that are particularly relevant to young people, so please free to pop along for advice and support.

News In Brief

• Attendance

As we look forward to another exciting school year, I would like to emphasise the importance of good attendance. Pupils' achievement is related to their attendance. If a pupil is not in school, they are missing out on valuable learning. Although 90% in a test is a good score, 90% ATTENDANCE is actually the equivalent to 20 days off school. This school year, the government is changing the threshold for persistent absence from 85% to 90%. This means that schools have to closely monitor pupils who are not achieving an overall attendance of at least 90%. As a result of this, for pupils whose attendance falls below 90% we will not be able to authorise further absence through illness without the school receiving such things as: a medical card, a doctor's letter or a prescription.

Punctuality

Being late to school can have a considerable impact over the whole school year. The table below shows you just how much time can be missed over a year just by being 5 minutes late to school every day:

5 minutes late every day = 3 days of school lost a year	
10 minutes late every day = 6.5 days of school lost a year	
15 minutes late every day = 10 days of school lost a year	
20 minutes late every day = 13 days of school lost a year	
30 minutes late every day = 19 days of school lost a year	

We understand that the school mornings can be hectic, but when a child is late for school they are missing out on vital parts of their education. Doors open at 8:50 a.m. and registration is completed by 9.05 a.m. Children arriving after 9:05 a.m. will be recorded as late. If a child arrives after 9:20 a.m., they will have an "unauthorised" mark – this is the same as an "unauthorised absence" and impacts on their overall attendance figure.

• Pupil Progress

As part of the reforms to the new national curriculum, which were introduced in September 2014, the current system of 'levels' used to report children's attainment and progress was removed at the end of the last academic year. The new Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 tests (Y2 and Y6) in English and Mathematics, based on the new national curriculum, will be sat by our pupils for the first time in the summer of 2016. To enable us to track the progress and attainment of our pupils from September 2015, we are introducing a number of new assessment tools, one of which is 'Assertive Mentoring'.

Assertive Mentoring identifies what a child can do, and targets what they need to do to make further progress. Every other week, your child will complete a short test in school. The teacher will go over the test and any misconceptions will be addressed. The completed test will also be brought home so that your child can share it with you. This will enable you to celebrate their successes and help them with any mistakes they have made. The same test will then be repeated the following week.

As a school we are looking forward to implementing this new system and hope that parents and carers will support their child as we seek to enable each pupil to fulfil their potential.
