Yesterday Mrs Frost's Y3/1 class, led an antibullying assembly entitled 'All different, All the Same'. It was very thought provoking and


just to show how unique and individual they all are, they were wearing odd socks! Well done Y3/1.





- speed is scary and noisy. It stops communities being enjoyable places for children and families to walk, talk and play.





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
