This week, in an article published on the BBC website, the N have called for further action on internet safety for children. reported that children are at significant risk from their us social media and that in the last 6 months alone, there have more than 1,300 grooming offences involving children. Almost 2/3 of the cases took place on Facebook, Snapchat and Instagram.

Here in school, we regularly have to deal with incidents involving our children's use of social media apps at home - the use of 'Whatsapp' being a significant cause for concern this last week.



As we prepare to celebrate Safer Internet Day next Tuesday, we would once again like to politely ask you to continue to support us, by keeping vigilant over our children's use of the internet in general and social media in particular. Please talk with your children about their use of the internet through their phones, tablets, computers and games consoles. Ask them to share with you the sites and apps which they use. Thank you.


