

• Do you know who your child is talking to?

We continue to promote e-Safety with all of the members of our school community so as to help to keep everyone safe. We have however, recently been alerted to an out of school incident, which is currently being investigated by the police. This incident occurred following the use of the app 'Snapchat'. A child made contact with someone who was pretending to be someone they were not. As always, we'd ask that parents / carers continue to talk to the children about e-safety:

- Are your settings private or public? ٠
- Don't accept friend requests from people you don't know. •
- You don't put up posters sharing your personal information, so don't online (address, school, age, phone number, etc.).
- Think before you post any photographs.
- Tell if you see something which upsets you.
