Young Carers Next Thursday 31st January 2019 is National Young Carers Awareness Day and as a school we will be

talking in our classes about being a Young Carer. The purpose of the day is to raise public awareness of the challenges faced by young people because of their caring role, and to campaign for greater support for young carers and their needs.

A Young Carer is a child or young person, from the age of 5 to their 18th birthday, who provides regular or on-going support to a family member, who has an illness, disability, poor mental health or misuses substances.

Mrs Allen is our Young Carer Champion and she has already spoken to the KS2 children about Young Carers. There are over 800,000 Young Carers in England with 756 identified in Stoke-on-Trent, that's an average of 1 in 12 children in every class. If you believe that your child may be a young carer and you would like to receive some support, please contact Mrs Allen and she will be happy to talk to you. Safer Internet Day - Tuesday 5th February 2019

Safer Internet day is an opportunity to talk with the children about consent; thinking about all the different ways we can say 'yes' or 'no' online. The internet is a wonderful place that offers so many opportunities for children to learn, connect and play, but, as the internet is always changing, being able to keep up to date with your child's internet use can sometimes be tricky. Safer Internet Day provides an opportunity to discuss and explore online issues with your child. The best way to find out what your child is doing online is to ask them to tell you about it. Encourage them to use devices in rooms where you are so that you can see what sites they're visiting and share with them.
