Firework Code

We have been celebrating STEM all week in school (Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths). On Wednesday we spoke to the Key Stage 2 children about the space race. We talked about the Apollo 11 rocket in which astronaut Neil Armstrong travelled as he took 'One small step for man and one giant leap for mankind', to become the first man to walk on the moon.

As Bonfire Night is approaching, we also talked to the children about rockets of a different kind. So that we all enjoy safe Bonfire Night celebrations, we would like to remind everyone of the following advice from Staffordshire Fire and Rescue

Service:

- ⇒ Light sparklers one at a time and wear gloves.
- ⇒ Never give sparklers to a child under five.
- ⇒ Only buy fireworks marked BS 7114.
- ⇒ Don't drink alcohol if setting off fireworks.
- ⇒ Keep fireworks in a closed box.
- ⇒ Follow the instructions on each firework.
- ⇒ Light them at arms length, using a taper.
- ⇒ Stand well back.
- ⇒ Never go near a firework that has been lit. Even if it hasn't gone off it could still explode.
- ⇒ Never put fireworks in your pocket or throw them.
- ⇒ Always supervise children around fireworks.
- ⇒ Keep pets indoors.
- ⇒ Don't set off noisy fireworks late at night and never after 11pm.
