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Eco Day will be taking place next Tuesday. On this day children will explore and learn about environmental issues affecting our world, make individual Eco promises and consider solutions to the problems. Nursery and Reception will be covering the litter problem; Y1 and Y2 will be learning about the issue of plastic and why it creates so many problems; Y3 and Y4 will think about the meaning of 'Reduce, Reuse and Recycle' and how we all need to think about



reducing what we buy. Y5 and Y6 will be taking part in a national challenge which has been devised following a recent report led by the World Wide Fund for Nature. The Living Planet Report shows that the way we are living on our planet at the moment is unsustainable, and that human activity is destroying the natural world and making it less able to provide for our needs. The challenge is for pupils to share their vision of life in the future. They could write a song or rap, a poem, letters or create a poster. We would also love our families to join us in making an Eco Promise too! Here are some suggestions:

- \Rightarrow Taking a reusable bottle out with you;
- \Rightarrow Always turning off the lights when they are not in use;
- \Rightarrow Recycling more at home;
- \Rightarrow Feeding the birds/wildlife;
- \Rightarrow Not leaving the tap running when brushing your teeth;
- \Rightarrow Always taking bags shopping;
- \Rightarrow Setting up and looking after a wildlife area/wild place left in garden;
- \Rightarrow Not buying plastic things unless necessary; and
- \Rightarrow Not wasting any food.

Following sickness

 If your child has been physically sick, then they must not return to school until 48 hours after the last bout of sickness;

Covid 19

- If your child is tested for Covid 19 then they should not return to school until either:
 - 1. a Negative text result can be shared with the office staff; or
 - 2. If they receive a positive result, that they have completed the 10 day quarantine.

Attendance

Since we have returned to school in September we have been so pleased with the children's enthusiasm and keenness to get back into school life. Due to the current situation, we know there have been a high number of enforced absences due to Covid and this is likely to continue well into the future.

However, our attendance is currently showing a percentage, over the past 7 days, of 97.7% and for the whole school year 96.4%. This shows a fantastic commitment by children and families and we would like to thank you for your continued support.

Parents' Evening Calls

We are now half way through our parent/carer progress calls and for those that have already had theirs, we hope you found it useful. The remaining classes can be seen on the right and will operate as described below.

- Appointments will have been booked on ParentMail Parents Evening between 3:30 and 6:30 p.m. only on the days shown for your child's class/year shown right. Please note: If you choose a different date not allocated to your child's class or year, it will show all times as 'Unavailable'.
- Appointment slots are every 10 minutes, but calls are expected to take approximately 5 minutes to allow teachers time to prepare for the next call.
- If your call, after 5 minutes, requires more time, the teacher may ask you to arrange a further call. This is because we do not want calls to run behind.
- When booking an appointment, please enter the phone number you wish to be called on, at your selected time, in the notes section.
- Vou need to be ready with your phone at your appointment time and need to be aware that when the teacher calls you, it will most likely indicate 'No Caller ID' or a similar message.

Prospective Nursery Virtual Open Evening

This year, due to Covid, we are unable to welcome prospective Nursery parents/ carers into school to show them and their children our Nursery classroom and outdoor spaces.
