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## A plea for a safe return....

It was lovely to see all the children back and we are very pleased that we made the decision to have half the children in yesterday and the other half today, in order to ease the children back into school, but also to test out arrangements.

On Monday when **all** the children return, we will stick to the details in the letter sent out via ParentMail last Friday 26<sup>th</sup> February, summarised below:

- Only one adult will be allowed on the school site;
- Adults are politely asked to wear a face covering on site, as well as to follow our one-way system, as before;
- Arrival and departure times are to be staggered and prompt arrival and departure at their allocated time and location as below;
- Families with siblings can all arrive at the time of the first child due, but please note that all siblings will now exit with their own class;
- Children can bring packed lunch, healthy snack, drink, reading books and diaries;
- Children should not bring mobile phone, pencils, pens, etc;
- No parents/carers in the school building, please speak to a staff member out front or e-mail parent@sandfordhill.org.uk .
- Only medicines with a care plan. If in doubt speak to the office.

Be assured, we are constantly reviewing these arrangements and we do very much appreciate your support and patience in following them, as we do our best to keep us all safe. We look forward to seeing you all on Monday morning.
