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A short week's update

Despite it only being a 3 day week for children (4 day week for staff) quite a bit has happened.

- ◆ Following our recent advert, we were pleased to welcome two new lunchtime supervisors, Mrs Austin and Miss Walklate. They have initially joined the Y2 bubble and we know they will be a valuable addition to the staff.
- ◆ Yesterday saw a range of staff training, including First Aid, taking place, as well as numerous other meetings and preparation activities which are often so difficult to squeeze into busy days.
- ◆ On Tuesday and Wednesday we held our virtual Parent's Evenings using SchoolCloud. We recognise there were a few teething issues for some users, as is often the case when introducing a new system, and we apologise for any inconvenience, but the verbal feedback so far has been really positive. Comments such as:
 - not having to bring the children out again after school;
 - not having to worry about parking;
 - electronically timed appointments meant that nothing ran late, so no waiting around;
 - more meetings with both parents (even in different locations) and sometimes the child too.

We will soon be sending out a survey to gather your feedback about the new system, so do let us know.

- ◆ You may have heard in the news this week the impact of children missing school swimming during the pandemic. We are therefore particularly pleased to share with you, that we have managed to organise double our usual swimming allocation for next year. In doing so, we hope to make sure that all the children leave Sandford Hill Primary able to swim the required minimum length of the pool.
- ◆ Finally, the building works to the new block at the back of the school are now progressing at speed. Next week there will be large concrete delivery vehicles bringing concrete for the base of the 2 new classrooms. Then the following week, the huge wooden frames for the classrooms, exactly like the ones for the front block, will be delivered and erected using another massive crane. All very exciting, but out front is still a building site, so please make sure you keep your child(ren) with you at all times on arrival and collection, just to be extra safe. Thank you.
