And the Build Goes On - Concrete Casting

This week the builders have been busy building a wooden frame structure, around the back of the school, ready for the base of the new 2 classroom block. Then today we have had a steady stream of concrete mixer trucks bringing 110 tonne or (110,000 kgs) of liquid concrete. The concrete has been poured into the wooden frame and will set to make the concrete base. Then the week after next, we are expecting a large crane and the delivery of the pre-made sides and roof, ready to build the new classroom block.
