Reflecting on events of the past year, it seems that schools themselves are often the last to know of the government's intentions. The Covid guidance, under which schools to are charged to operate, has not changed radically since it was introduced in July 2020. Whole School End of Year Activities

- ⇒ All year groups will have an end of year 'Party Day' including games and sporting activities, a picnic and fun on an inflatable. More details to follow.
- ⇒ Whilst we will be unable to hold our normal 'Sports day' this year, we are currently working hard behind the scenes to arrange a Sports Week for early September. A wide range of sporting experiences are being arranged for the children to enjoy.

Year 6 End of Year Activities

In addition to this, the Year 6 children are busy finalising further arrangements before they leave us for High School. We will not be holding an 'End of Year Leavers Disco' this year (Covid and the building works make this too much of a challenge to safely commit too), but instead we are very excited to inform you that we are arranging:

- subsidised trip to West Midlands Safari Park, with leavers' T-shirt (payment information to follow via ParentMail);
- End of year production (recorded for parents);
- Countryside hike with a picnic;
- a Harry Potter day; and
- A 'Festival in the Field' followed by a sleepover in school with Dominoes pizza;.

Walk to School Week

Over the course of the year, we've all appreciated the freedom of going for a walk and getting some fresh air. This is something that we see the children doing during playtimes every day and something that should be regularly encouraged. Walk to School week is a child-led initiative where the children are encouraged to make positive choices around how they travel to and from school with them then receiving badges based on these

positive choices. On average, schools that participate in Walk to School week see a 30% reduction in car usage as a means of getting to school, meaning that we can also help to reduce our impact on the environment.
