Although Miss Heath is resigning from her class teacher post, she will be returning in September to support us with our tutoring programme.

September Arrangements

Our intention in September is for all pupils to return to school with no restrictions in place. The arrival and departure times, for each cohort, can be found below. With this said however, I am most mindful, that the current Covid infection rate across the city (410.3 infections per 100,00 people) is a similar figure to when the country was put into lockdown in January. Indeed, having spoken to a number of headteachers, yesterday, the number of schools across our city being adversely impacted through both pupil and staff absence, has never been higher! Please note that as September approaches, in the interests of keeping everyone safe, we may need to adapt these start and end times. Should this be the case, you will be notified as soon as possible. Finally, if we are able to operate 'normally' from September extra-curricular activities will begin week commencing 20.09.21 (the week after our Sports Week).

- If you can't make it into your local library then you can also join in with the reading challenge online via the Summer Reading Challenge website.
- We are challenging you to visit your library three times and read six books during the summer holidays - it doesn't matter what you read as long as you enjoy what you read! We love to find out what you've been reading for your summer challenge - so why not come and tell us what you've been reading and what you thought of it?
- With each of your three library visits we'll have some little goodies to give you such as stickers (bonus: some of the stickers are even smelly!)
- When you complete your challenge you'll receive a certificate and medal to take home and keep. Why not take your medal into school in September to show your teachers what you've been doing over the summer?
