Protecting your child against flu

Reception to Year 6 pupils only

This year, the School Immunisation Team will once again be visiting school to deliver Nasal Flu Vaccinations to pupils in Reception to Year 6.

With COVID-19 still in circulation, it is important to reduce the number of those becoming ill with flu this winter to help protect them, the NHS and social care.

This vaccination is free and is a quick and simple spray up the nose. Even if your child had it last year, it is

recommended to have the flu vaccine again this year.

Some people may not accept the use of porcine

gelatine in medical products. The nasal flu vaccination is considered the most appropriate vaccine, however if this is not suitable, there is an alternative injectable porcine free vaccine available this year. This will be an injection, rather than a nasal spray and may need to be given in a clinic setting, rather than school. If you would like your child to receive the

alternative vaccination, please tick the relevant box on the consent page of the e-consent form.

The e-consent form will be sent to you on ParentMail on Monday.

Your child will only be eligible to receive the vaccine if you fill in the consent form. If you do not complete the form, your child will not be on the list.

reasons

to get your child vaccinated

1. Protect your child

The vaccine will help protect your child against flu and serious complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia

2. Protect you, your family and friends

Vaccinating your child will help protect more vulnerable friends and family

3. No injection needed

The nasal spray is painless and easy to have

4. It's better than having flu

The nasal spray helps protect against flu, has been given to millions of children worldwide and has an excellent safety record

5. Avoid costs

If your child gets flu, you may have to take time off work or arrange alternative childcare
