The Christmas Assembly ticket request form will be sent out by the end of today via ParentMail. As you MUST have a ticket to see your child's assembly, please make sure you look in Forms and book your seat. (Strictly 2 adults per child)



The doors for the Christmas assemblies will open at 9:00am and the assemblies will start around 9:15am once pupils are registered. Each assembly will last for around 15-20 minutes and will take place in the school hall. To help keep everyone safe, we are limiting the number of adults to 2 per family for each performance. There will be no exception to the number of adults allowed.

We would also like to invite our **Nursery** parents/carers to join us to listen to the children perform Christmas songs in the hall. Again there will be a limit of **2 adults per family with no exceptions.** Doors will open at 2:20pm and the children will sing three Christmas songs at approximately 2:30pm.

We will be sending out a ParentMail form for you to confirm your attendance as we will be operating a ticketing system. Those who join us for these occasions are politely asked to wear an appropriate face covering when in the school building.

If your child's assembly has to be cancelled at short notice, we do intend to record one of the practices beforehand for you still to enjoy.
