The COP26 climate change conference in Glasgow is making us all think about what else we can do as individuals to help our world.

At school we have recycling bins for batteries and crisp packets so children can bring these in to recycle. This really helps as it stops them going into landfill.

Supermarkets are now able to recycle more. Both Tesco and the Co-op have new bins collecting soft plastics. This includes bread bags, sweet and chocolate wrappers, clear film, salad and vegetable bags, crisp packets and pet food pouches.
