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Safer Internet Day

On Tuesday, the pupils had a fantastic time celebrating Safer Internet Day and learning about the importance of being responsible and respectful online for this year's theme "All fun and games?"

Nursery and Reception used the story of Smartie The Penguin to learn when to tell an adult if something they see online upsets them; Y1 watched a video about a chicken who is tricked by a rooster and wrote letters to him to advise him how to keep safe; Y2 created their own

'Responsible Recipes' to make the internet a kind and safe place; Y3 decided which information was safe for them to share online and which they should keep private, creating fans to display in their classroom as reminders; Y4 shared the story of Digiduck and the Magic Castle and looked at how this applies to our SMART rules; Y5 made fortune tellers which they could play with and share advice for positive behaviour when playing online games; Y6 made posters to advise children and adults about how to use online gaming platforms safely and respectfully.

It was wonderful to see the learning and discussion taking place around school and the heart at first-hand how our children are learning to become thoughtful, respectful and responsible digital citizens.

As well as these classroom based activities, our Digital Leaders prepared and delivered assemblies to share some key information with the rest of the school. The key message which was shared was that no matter if we are online or offline, it is important that we are always, thoughtful, respectful and kind. Thank you to our Digital Leaders (and Mr Jones) for working so hard to prepare the assemblies and for delivering these with an impressive level of maturity.

Fantastic Food Technology

It is lovely to see children enjoying our technology room. This week, Y6 have had fantastic time creating healthy Fritattas. They have worked extremely well together as a team using many skills: chopping using the bridge and claw technique, whisking, baking and even washing up after themselves!
