Understanding Attendance Matters

We send the children to school everyday and think nothing of it, but what happens when your child is off school for any reason.

The school is required to closely track children's absence for morning and afternoon sessions and provide a code for any reason they might be off.

If your child needs to have a medical appointment during school time, please do try and arrange it so they can get there attendance mark by only keeping them out of school for the appointment time.

As soon as a child's absence falls below 90% this is called Persistent Absence (PA). If this occurs the following procedure starts:

- Parent/carers are contacted and are sent a '1st Letter of Concern' to notify that this is the case. If attendance does not improve then stage 2.
- 2. Parent/carers are sent a '2nd Letter of Concern'
- 3. Parent/carer will be invited to an attendance clinic.
- 4. Should there be a further number of unauthorised absences then parents/carers can be fined.

If a child has 90% absence across a whole school year it equates to almost 4 weeks of school or 120 guided learning hours - that is an awful lot of learning missed and an almost impossible gap to make up.

Thank you for supporting school in ensuring the highest attendance possible .


Y3 Times Table Rockstars Competition
