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# Good luck to all of our children taking their Standard Assessment Tests (SATs)!

After all the disruption the children have experienced over the past 3 years, my heart goes out to all of them who are having to sit tests, this month. Sadly, the Government say the children have to take



them, so we have no choice but to follow this expectation. This week, Year 2 have been working very hard and have completed their reading SAT and next week, Year 6 will be taking tests in reading, mathematics and spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPaG). The most important thing to remind your child, if they are in Year 2 or Year 6, is to try their best and to remember that they all have many skills, talents and qualities that a test does not measure. As well as this, please remind your child that all of the adults in school are there for them and if your child does feel at all anxious – please remember that talking is good. A problem aired is a problem shared.

## Attendance Matters—Today and Everyday

Over the last year, there have been many changes in guidance relating to attendance about when to keep your child at home. Whilst COVID is ongoing, it is important that if your child tests positive, they stay home for 3 days before returning to school. That said, it is vital that your child attends school whenever they are well enough to do so. We understand that there have recently been cases of chicken pox and that some absence is unavoidable but if your child is well enough to be in school then please ensure that they attend. A reminder that we are able to administer medicines in the event your child feels slightly unwell. Thank you for your continued support.

## Parent/Carer Notices

<u>Y6 Swimming</u> - Y6 pupils will not swim next week due to SATs. Other year groups will swim as normal.

<u>Gate Closure</u> - The Bambury Street gate entrance will be locked for the next 2 weeks from 12:30pm to 2:30pm for the Forest School programme. We apologise for any inconvenience this may cause but the safeguarding of our pupils is of the upmost importance. <u>Chicken Pox/Scarlet Fever</u> - We have received communication that chicken pox and scarlet fever may be doing the rounds. We are aware that a lot of pupils have recently been absent with chicken pox but we wanted to make you aware of the symptoms.

<u>Chicken pox</u> is a red itchy rash that turn into spots. These spots then fill with clear liquid before rupturing and turning crusty. Before the spots appear, your child may seem generally unwell, have a high temperature or loss of appetite. If you're child develops chicken pox, it is important that they do not return to school until **ALL** spots have crusted over as they are highly contagious until then. <u>Scarlet Fever</u> can cause flu-like symptoms, including a high temperature, a sore throat and swollen neck glands. A rash appears 12 to 48 hours later. It looks like small, raised bumps and starts on the chest and tummy, then spreads. The rash makes your skin feel rough, like sandpaper. Scarlet fever is contagious but is easily treated with antibiotics

This week, our KS2 cross country teams returned to Northwood stadium to compete in this year's cross country competition. For


many, this was their first opportunity representing Sandford Hill and we are very proud of them all. The behaviour of all pupils was
