Attendance

In some circumstances a score of 90% would be something to celebrate. In the context of attendance, your child is at risk academically if their attendance is 90% or below. Missing 10



percent of the school year, or about 19 days through sporadic, not just consecutive, absences matter. Before you know it – just one or two days a month can add up and your child will be missing valuable learning time, when those children who are at school are improving their skills and knowledge and laying the foundation to become literate and numerate. Occasionally, children get sick and need to stay at home. What is important is getting your child to school as often as possible.
