The Starfish Story by Loren Eisley

One day a man was walking along the beach, when he noticed a boy picking up and gently throwing things into the ocean. Approaching the boy, he asked, "Young man, what are you doing?"

The boy replied, "Throwing starfish back into the ocean. The surf is up and the tide is going out. If I don't throw them back, they'll die."

The man laughed to himself and said, "don't you realise there are miles and miles of beach and hundreds of starfish? You can't make any difference!"

After listening politely, the boy bent down, picked up another starfish, and threw it into the surf. Then, smiling at the man, he said,

"I made a difference to that one."

Regular attendance at school makes a difference.

Regular school attendance is essential if children are to achieve their full potential. Research commissioned by the Department for Education shows missing school for even a day can mean a child is less likely to achieve good grades, which can have a damaging effect on their life chances. At Sandford Hill Primary School we believe that regular school attendance enables children to maximise the educational opportunities available to them whilst at the same time, missing out on lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind in their work.

We therefore politely request that you:

- take a positive interest in your child's work and educational progress;
- support the school by becoming involved in your child's education, forming a positive relationship with school and acknowledging the importance of children receiving the same messages from both school and home;
- ensure your child has regular attendance at school;
- contact the school if your child is absent to let us know the reason why and the expected date of return;
- avoid unnecessary absences; for example, by making medical and dental appointments for outside of school hours;
- ask to talk to a member of the school staff if your child is experiencing difficulties with any aspect of
- their school work or home and family life;
- inform the school of any change in circumstances that may impact on your child's attendance; and
- attend all meetings requested to discuss attendance issues.

With all of these in mind, we do still appreciate that there might be days when your child is ill, require urgent medical or dental appointments which unavoidably fall in school time, or there are other emergencies which may result in your child being absent from school.

If your child is absent from school, we kindly ask you to contact the school office, preferably by 9.30 a.m. on the first morning of absence (or reply promptly to any request or inquiry concerning an absence) by reporting via the ParentMail app, email parent@sandfordhill.org.uk or call 01782 235781 to speak to the office or to leave a message. - **PE Kit & Days** —P.E. lessons will start next week on the days listed on right.
