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### Attendance Matters

At Sandford Hill, we believe that regular attendance is imperative in ensuring that each child has the opportunity to thrive and to be the best that they can be. We understand that there will be occasions when children are unwell with coughs/cold and stomach bugs but otherwise, please ensure they attend school regularly.

- \*If your child has 98% attendance, this equates to 4 days off per year
- \*If they have 95% attendance, this equates to 9 days off per year
- \*If they have 90% attendance, this equates to 20 days per year resulting in them missing out on 20 maths lessons, 20 English lessons, 20 lunchtimes spent with friends.

Attendance is important. If your child is well enough, please ensure that they come to school everyday, on time. School are able to administer medicines should you child feel slightly under the weather, please sign these in at the office/FSU. Please remember to report all absence on the ParentMail or absence line by 9:15 a.m.


