Attendance League

In school we have introduced a class attendance competition. Each week the attendance for one class will be compared with the attendance of another class. Out of the two classes, the one with the higher attendance will be awarded 3 points for a win unless they have an identical percentage, for the week, in which case each class will be awarded 1 point.

The class competition is now in week 6 having started during week commencing 23.01.23 and below you can see the current table. Each of the Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 classes will compete against each other on 2 occasions and the final round of fixtures will take place during week commencing 14.07.23.
