Year Group	Phonemes (Sounds)	Example words
Nursery	Nursery have been learning the nursery rhyme 'Baa Baa Black Sheep'	
Reception	i, n, m and d	Recognising the letters and sounds in words
Year 1	CCVC words (consonant, consonant, vowel, consonant)	frog, plum and club
Year 2	adding suffixes -s, -es, -er and -est to words	frogs, bushes, brighter, darkest
